- God uses certain books to relate certain truths to us. Ecclesiastes is a

 of wisdom would remain. The book of Ecclesiastes reflects the thinking of
 some one who had wandered far from God and who had lost their
 integrity.
- Esther is written to show that, even though we don't see God moving, He is still moving.

I. Adopted; Esther 2:5-7

- a. King threw a party for 6-months
 - Decided to show his wife, Vashti, as a trophy in doing so commanded his wife to come to be displayed before all his leader
 - ii. Vashti told him she would not come
- b. A new wife was selected by the choosing of Esther not just for her self, but to save her people
 - i. God was working in her situation for reasons greater than her own benefit
 - ii. Important to note: God was doing something for a reason in all our lives, doing what He has us doing for a particular reason

- c. Esther was adopted & raised by her cousin Mordecai
 - i. His position was a leader "at the gate" where adjudication was done; he had a place of status
 - ii. Mordecai's place made it possible for Esther to be selected because she had some status, some standing.
 - iii. Esther, like us, was POSITIONED BY ADOPTION to be used by God to do a significant work.

II. Anointed; Esther 2:8-9

- a. In a beauty contest something has to make a woman stand out. When Esther was put in the harem, she won the favor of Haggai and he saw something in her that was different.
- b. What distinguishes us that on our insides that can impact/effect others. What is it about us that makes us different? Its more than capability; its "excellence of spirit" that distinguishes each of us.
- c. Haggai provided the best to Esther to help her because he favored her.
- d. Esther gave a gift to the king of Haggai's choosing

III. Appointed; Est 2:9-17d

- a. Sometimes you have to go thru difficulty to attain the victory
 - i. There are times when we have to go thru things that don't seem right to get victory
 - ii. Its not about our comfort but about attaining victory for others.
 - iii. Jesus was born in a stable a stinking place & laid in a feeding trough to accomplish his will.
 - iv. What are we willing to go thru to see others saved and see this nation saved?
